Paris Olympics Service Information

The 2024 Summer Olympics will be held in Paris from Friday 26th July to Sunday 11th August, followed by the Paralympics from Wednesday 28th August to Sunday 8th September.

Before, during and after the Olympics there will be road closures throughout Paris to accommodate the setup of event locations, competition arenas, and fanzones. These closures may affect our normal bus tour routes, stop availability, and bus frequency.

Our goal is to keep running our routes as close as possible to the main attractions and landmarks, even if they are being used as an event locations, such as the Eiffel Tour or Les Invalides.

The Big Bus Information Center at Stop 1, located at 11 avenue de l'Opéra will remain open daily from 9:30am to 5:30pm.

Full Service Closure Dates

Due to exceptional circumstances, our service will be fully closed on the following dates:

Partial Service Closures

Due to sports events in the heart of the city, we will operate a half-day service with timed/dated panoramic tours on the following dates:

24 & 25 July: from 9am - 1:30pm

1 August: from 9am - 1:30pm

2 August: from 6pm - 8:30pm

5 & 8 Aug: buses will operate from 12pm

11 August: buses will operate from 1pm

On these days, timed/dated panoramic tours will depart exclusively from Stop 1.

River Cruise & Night Tour

Seine River Cruise

Due to restrictions on the River Seine, Big Bus combination products including a cruise ticket will not be available from 18 - 27 July 2024. This includes Essential and Explore tickets.

Night Tour

Except on full closure days, the Night Tour will operate as usual at 9:15pm from Stop 5: Champs-Elysées.

Additional Service Updates

The Big Bus Information Centre located at Stop 1 will be open daily to inform and guide customers.

On operating days, Big Bus staff will be present at our main stops as usual.

We will continue running tours to Stop 8: Eiffel with reduced mobility. Tower for as long as possible in July (pending official notice from the authorities).

The service is expected to run every 10 minutes.

Electric Buses

By the start of the Summer Olympics, nearly our entire fleet of buses in Paris will be 100% electric.

This also means that the entire fleet will be accessible for wheelchair users and people with reduced mobility.
